## Things you need to know

### Entry Requirements for Courses at UNIMORE

The way you apply for admission to a degree course at UNIMORE depends on whether you are an EU or a non-EU citizen. For some courses it may be necessary to undergo an admission examination, interview or verification of your academic qualifications. General information on applications to Italian universities can be found on the website [www.studiare-in-italia.it/](http://www.studiare-in-italia.it/) of the Italian Ministry of Education, University and Research. ### Tuition Fees

The amount you pay depends on the degree course you choose. Tuition costs per academic year are approximately as indicated below.

- First Cycle Degrees
1. Three-year degree courses (Bachelor's programs, or Laurea) range from a minimum of €600 to a maximum of €1,700 per academic year.
- Second Cycle Degrees
2. Two-year degree course (Master's programs, or Laurea Magistrali): min. €600 – max. €2,100.
  3. Single-cycle degree courses (Lauree magistrali a ciclo unico): min. €600 – max. €2,100.
- Third Cycle Degrees.
- Specialization Courses/Schools: min. €600 Euros – €max. 2,000.
- Each year, tuition and fees must be paid in two instalments:  
The first instalment at the time of registration; the second instalment before 30 April.

### Scholarships and facilities

UNIMORE offers you reductions in tuition according to your financial situation. If you are interested in a reduction you must submit a financial-aid application. If you meet the requirements, you will be entitled to a reduction or, in some cases, be exempted from payment of the second instalment. While enrolled at UNIMORE, students are entitled to insurance for personal accidents and third party liability. Third party liability insurance is also valid for medical students working in hospitals.

### Scholarships

Once you are enrolled at UNIMORE you can apply for the following:

1. A scholarship with total exemption from tuition fees;
2. A reduction of tuition (for those not eligible for total exemption).

### Opportunities for part-time work within the University

Students can apply for part-time work, at a rate of €7.75 an hour, within the University. Part-time work placements for students are known as *Collaborazioni studentesche retribuite* (150 ore). Applications for part-time work can be submitted to ER.GO ( UNIMORE Partner ) once a year (usually before the start of the academic year).

Application notices are in Italian only. If you need assistance, you can contact the local ER.GO offices.

ER.GO provides a network of eating establishments, within its own facilities or in selected public restaurants/bars, which offer student discounts.

### Accommodation

Accommodation is assigned in two ways:

facilitated access is reserved for students from outside the local area who are on the eligibility list published every year in the month of July. The eligibility list is compiled by ER.GO on the basis of parameters relating to student needs and achievement;

free access is for all students, including those participating in international mobility projects, who require part-time or temporary accommodations.

### Transport

All students enrolled in the University of Modena and Reggio Emilia are entitled to special monthly passes and reduced fares for city transit, with no route or time limitations.

### UNIMORE Language Center

International students will be given an Italian language test, which takes place at the university, usually at the beginning of September. Students will be exempted from this test if they have an internationally recognized language certification considered adequate for studying in Italy at the university level, as indicated on the Study in Italy website.

If you are an EU or non-EU citizen already in Italy with a study visa, you are not required to take the Italian language test.

The University Language Center offers language courses and foreign language proficiency certificates in Italian as well as other foreign languages, such as English, Spanish, German, French, Chinese and Arabic.

Personalized language assistance is also offered through the three University Self-Access Centers, which provide comprehensive independent study facilities (satellite television, multimedia computers, CALL facilities, electronic resources, e-journals, etc.) and where experienced language tutors are available for individualized support. <http://www.cla.unimore.it/>

### International mobility

The Erasmus program is one of the best-known Community actions and has become a driver in the modernisation of higher education in Europe. The purpose of Erasmus is to improve the quality of higher education and strengthen its European dimension. It encourages transnational cooperation between universities, fostering the European mobility of students and teachers, and contributing to improved transparency and academic recognition of qualifications and studies throughout the European Union.

Erasmus students get a financial grant of about 350,00 euros per month. The study period goes from a minimum of 3 months to a maximum of 12 months.
